**Monday:** Abiding In Him

This morning's scripture is Numbers 6:25-26 – "the LORD makes his face shine on you and be gracious to you; the LORD turns his face toward you and gives you peace."

Invite Christ into your thoughts by whispering His name; suddenly your day brightens and feels more user friendly. When you speak His Name in loving trust, you sense His Presence and feel yourself drawing closer to Him.

There is great Power in His Name: Simply whispering "Jesus" can turn a hard day into a good day. By calling on His Name frequently, you acknowledge your continual need for Him. As you look to Him, His Face shines upon you in radiant approval; brightening your day and helping you to feel secure.

Christ is waiting to hear and to respond to you, but it is up to you to reach out to Him so you may receive the benefits of His Love and His Presence. Remember that no matter what is happening in your life, you are not alone for Christ is there for you.

Tuesday: Grace

This morning's scripture is 2 Corinthians 12:9 – "But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me."

Christ's Grace is sufficient for us, but its sufficiency is for one day at a time. That is why it is essential for us to learn how to live in the present, not the past or the future, but now.

Our minds so easily slip into the future, where worries abound. We also spend way too much time analyzing the past. Meanwhile, splendors of th present moment parade before us, and we do not even notice. Part of the problem is our tendency to strive for self-sufficiency. He will help us learn to rest in His sufficiency, depending on Him more and more.

We need His grace in order to live in the present. Grace is all aabout His provision for us, but accepting that goes against the grain of our natural tendencies. Each day we face a number of situations requiring His help. Moment by moment Christ proffers to us the needed assistance. Our part is to recognize our neediness and receive what He offers.

His Presence is with us always, providing everything we need. So don't worry about tomorrow's needs. Don't worry about yesterday's mistakes. His sufficiency is for a day at a time and that time is today!

## Wednesday: Fear

This morning's scripture is Romans 8:15 – "The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. [a] And by him we cry, "Abba, [b] Father."

Fearfulness is a form of bondage. Christ died on the cross for us so that we would not be a slave to fear. When He sees His children continuing to live in bondage to fear, He is grieved. His sacrifice was not only to provide forgiveness of sins but also to open the way to our Heavenly Father's heart. Now that we trustHim as Savior, we are the recipient of perfect Love; His Love, Abba's Love. This perfect Love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment (and there is no punishment for His followers).

People are born into the world in spiritual bondage, including bondage to fear. Becausse we inhabit both a fallen world and a fallen body, it is not easy to break free from fearfulness. However, the Spirit of adoption can help you in this struggle, enabling us to see ourselves as we truly are: Much-loved children of God! The Spirit frees you to cry out, "Abba, Father," believing we are His precious, adopted children. In the presence of a loving, strong father even the most frightened child eventually calms down. We have a perfectly loving, infinitely strong Father, so bring your fears freely to Him. Let Him hole us close to His Abba-heart, where we know we are safe. Open our hearts to receive vast quantities of His love. The more of this Love we hold in our hearts, the less room there is for fear. Receive His Love in full measure!
