Monday: Peace over Pressure

Isaiah 31:15 – “In repentance and rest is your salvation, in quietness and trust is our strength.”

Matthew 2:11 – On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother, Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him.

Wednesday: A Heart That Listens

Isaiah 31:21 – Whether you turn to the right or to the left, your ears will hear a voice behind you, saying, “This is the way; walk in it.”
